Transition Services

Giving Eaton County Kids Opportunities (GECKO) is a community-based and in-district work experience program available to students ages 15 and up enrolled in local district special education programs and Meadowview School.

Pre-Employment Transition Services focus on students in grades 9 and 10 in the areas of vocational counseling, self-advocacy, work-based learning, job shadows and post-secondary education counseling.

Meadowview School

Meadowview School serves students in Eaton County who have autism spectrum disorders, moderate to severe cognitive impairments, physical and emotional impairments requiring specialized instruction and related services as determined through an Individualized Education Program (IEP). These center-based special education programs are located at Eaton RESA's Packard building, Potterville Public Schools, Eaton Rapids Public Schools and in the City of Charlotte.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Career Preparation Center

The Eaton RESA Career Preparation Center (CPC) provides career and technical education programs to students in grades 11 and 12 from across our service area. Eaton RESA operates 17 different programs in partnership with Lansing Community College, Davenport University, Farm Bureau Insurance, The Univeristy of Olivet, Potter Park Zoological Society, Lansing Capital Region International Airport, and AIS Construction Company. Students attend their high school for a half day and the CPC for a half day. Many of our programs offer students the opportunity to earn industry, state and/or national certifications and college credit.

Capital Region Technical Early College

Capital Region Technical Early College (CRTEC) is a three-year high school-to-college program for students in grades 11 to 13. Eligible and enrolled students can earn college credits toward an associate degree and/or certifications. CRTEC is an opportunity for students who have clear career goals and are ready for post-secondary learning. Eaton RESA offers 14 different programs of study within CRTEC.



SCHOOL WELLNESS & PREVENTION SERVICES AGE BIRTH TO AGE 26

School Wellness & Prevention Services provide supports to schools, families and communities in Clinton, Eaton and Ingham counties to promote health and reduce youth risk behaviors. Our services include professional development opportunities for educators, front-line workers and other community partners that promote best practice strategies for increasing protective factors and reducing risk factors in the community.

Other services support efforts to increase nutrition, physical activity and health education in schools, and various prevention/intervention initiatives addressing parenting, pregnant teens, truancy, bullying, suicide and youth mental health.

The Behavioral and Mental Health Services team is made up of master's level and above clinicians who dedicate their time to providing individualized services to Eaton County students.

Our direct services extend from the GSRP classrooms to 12th grade and above and to our non-traditional learners. Our team prides itself on meeting the students and their families, where they are, which may mean in the classroom, at the coffee shop or on a virtual platform.

The team provides indirect services including building capacity through professional development and education for anyone who touches the lives of our youth, be it teachers, peers, families, community partners and/or others.

Additionally, our specialists work with our local districts to provide other services including crisis intervention, play therapy, threat assessment support, suicide education/prevention, cognitive behavioral therapy and other therapeutic services as needed.


FINANCE & OPERATIONS

Eaton RESA's total 2022-23 operating budget was \$53.5 million. Accounting for the district's operations is managed through three distinct operating funds, the General Fund, the Special Education Fund and the Career and Technical Education Fund, as noted in the graphs below.

General Fund – The General Fund accounts for approximately 29% of the district's total budget with roughly one-half of this fund comprising grant funded programs such as Early Childhood, Adult Education and various Prevention programs. This fund also supports the district's administrative, facility and technology services with intra-district transfers from the Special Education and Career and Technical Education funds to offset a proportionate share of these costs. The remaining items in the General Fund include curriculum and other instructional services to support local district work.

Special Education Fund – Eaton RESA's Special Education Fund represents about 64% of the district's total operating budget. This fund accounts for the cost of salaries and benefits for direct instructional, related services, administrative and other support staff. It also includes contracted transportation services for students with disabilities. The district operates several center-based special education classrooms and provides related services for all of its constituent districts.

Career and Technical Education Fund – Eaton RESA's Career and Technical Education (CTE) Fund accounts for about 9% of the district's total operating budget. Student programs are made available through contractual agreements with various higher education and business partners. CTE staff also provide career guidance and pupil support services to students who attend the Career Preparation Center or are in local districts through various career development services, CTE programs and/or the Capital Region Technical Early College.

TECHNOLOGY SERVICES

The Information Technology Department for the district provides the infrastructure for telecommunications and data services in support of the organization's broad range of educational and administrative services.

Technology services are provided to support operations of the district and the work being done by end users including: printing services, web-based help desk, mobile device support, security solutions, software application supports, telecommunication support and network support.

WAN/MISEN

The Wide Area Network (WAN) connects our local districts (Charlotte, Eaton Rapids, Grand Ledge, Maple Valley and Potterville), as well as Eaton RESA to each other and to the internet through leased broadband fiber optics. This consortium of districts saves significant financial resources and allows for strategic partnerships with educational stakeholders around the state.





COMMUNICATIONS & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Communication is vital in any organization and this is why it continues to be a part of the strategic plan. It is a continuous effort to work with staff, students, parents and the community to share information and opportunities.

Over the past several years, Eaton RESA has made a significant effort to explore communication needs for internal and external stakeholders. Annual surveys and focus groups are implemented to continually assess our communication structures and tools, including social media platforms.

A horizontal and vertical communication process has been put in place with regularly scheduled communications to staff and constituents, including a monthly staff newsletter and board briefs. Progress continues to be made with communication to ensure an open and transparent environment. While the overall state of communication has significantly improved over the past several years at Eaton RESA, continuous improvement efforts to increase reciprocal communications are being addressed.
