Learning About the Law

- •What is the law about?

What is the law about?

- The law requires extra support for DK-3rd grade students who are not at grade level in reading
- It also requires that a child be retained in 3rd grade if they are more than 1 grade level behind by the end of 3rd grade



What Do I Need to Know As a Parent?

Your child's reading progress will be closely monitored
If your child isn't reading at grade level, an Individual Reading Improvement Plan (IRIP) will be created. The plan includes:

•Extra instruction or support in reading areas of need

•Ongoing checks on reading progress

•A Read at Home Plan (RAHP)

•You have the right and are encouraged to be involved every step of the way!



How will this affect my child?

- Your school will continue using a screener in DK-3rd grade to identify students who need extra help with reading
- If your child is identified as needing additional supports your school will provide your child with an Individual Reading Improvement Plan (IRIP) and a Read at Home Plan (RAHP)



What is an IRIP and RAHP?



Individual Reading Improvement Plan*

- Plan for the school staff (teachers, interventionists) with specific activities and targeted supports to help your student
- Will include tracking the student's progress on the activities

Read at Home Plan

- Plan for the family that engages you and your child in reading and writing outside of the school day
- Will include an invitation to the Parent Workshops to support parents at home in the specific activities

*Your child will not miss regular reading instruction as a part of this plan.



How will this affect my child?

- •This part of the law will apply starting when this year's 1st grade (2017-18) reach 3rd grade
 - •A student will not be promoted to 4th grade unless they are less than 1 grade level behind by the end of 3rd grade
- •A child will only be required to repeat 3rd grade once



What Can I Do to Support My Child?

- Ensure your child attends school daily!
- Talk positively about school
- Do reading activities with your child even in the summer!

•Some examples include:

•Play rhyming games - I am thinking of a word that rhymes with _____

- •Play sound games I spy something that starts with the sound /t/ [tree]
- •Look for letters on signs as you drive down the road
- •Listen to nursery rhymes and children's songs and discuss the rhyming words
- •Read together you read a sentence, they read a sentence
- •Talk about what you read in books, newspaper, online, or in magazines
